Insert catheters only for appropriate indications

Minimize use in all patients, particularly those at higher risk of CAUTI and mortality

STOP | Does This Patient Meet the CDC Guidelines for Indwelling Urethral Catheter Use?

- Patient has acute urinary retention or bladder outlet obstruction
- Need for accurate urine output measurements
- Use for selected surgical procedures
- To assist in healing of open sacral or perineal wounds
- Patient requires prolonged immobilization
- To improve comfort for end of life care

- Consider using urinary catheter systems with pre-connected sealed catheter tubing junction
- Select the smallest French size appropriate indwelling urinary catheter
- Obtain assistance to facilitate appropriate visualization and sterile insertion technique
- Always follow physician orders and institutional rules, regulations and guidelines.
